However, I am passing this information along to you, and I am delighted over the fact that you have heard as late as December 10 from your husband. This morning, Mr. Carter received a letter from Amon Junior dated October 10, which is the latest communication from him. He acknowledged another cigar parcel but said he was still waiting for his food parcel and that a Red Cross representative had not been there in five months. However, from your letter, they must have received personal food parcels or he could not have been preparing a chili dinner.

We, too, received a Christmas card from Amon yesterday.

It was certainly sweet of you to give us all the information you have in your letters and you may rest assured that anything of any interest Mr. Carter receives from Amon Junior will be passed along to you promptly. Any time you have anything and will be good enough to call collect, we shall be glad to have it.
