

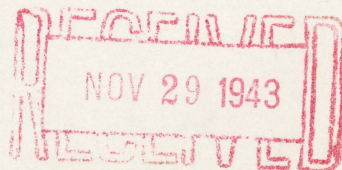

Dear Mayor McCrary:

I have delayed replying to your telegram of November 16 and that of the Fort Worth Chamber of Commerce of the same date, also your letter of November 18, in the matter of the location of the terminal building at the Arlington Airport, pending further investigation and study.

We had been under the impression that the recommendation of Mr. Jesse Jones, pursuant to his letter of August 27 wherein the terminal building was to be placed at northwest corner of the airport, was going to decide the matter, it having been approved by all parties except the City of Dallas. The recommendation of Mr. Jones in his letter to you of November 1, however, in which he states "the north central location will be more equally accessible to both sides of the field", seems to express a preference on his part to that location rather than the one formerly recommended. We are still studying this situation and will advise you of our further deliberations.

I am sending a copy of this letter to Mr. William Holden of the Fort Worth Chamber of Commerce for his information.
