Dear Amon:


Since our conversation during your recent visit to Washington, I have given thought to a further allocation of Federal Centennial funds to Fort Worth and it is with regret that I am obliged to inform you that this cannot be done.

When the Fort Worth allocation of \$250,000 was increased by the Commission, upon my request, to \$300,000 late last summer, the Commission decided definitely against making any other allocations from the appropriation. At a meeting of the Commission in Washington on last Wednesday, this policy was unanimously reaffirmed.

I am sorry that we cannot be of further financial assistance to you because I feel that you and the people of Fort Worth did a really outstanding job. I am sure you will understand, however, my position in the matter.
