

New Air Force Chief of Staff To Speak at Writers Meeting

The newly appointed chief of staff of the Air Force, Gen Nathan Twining, will speak in Dallas Friday at the annual Aviation Writers Association convention.

Gen. Twining's talk to more than 250 aviation writers from throughout the country, will climax a six-day Dallas-Fort Worth meeting. He will address the closing banquet in the Adolphus Hotel.

Members of the association will arrive Monday at Carswell Air Force Base west of Fort Worth. For three days the writers will tour air installations in that area, visiting Carswell, Consolidated-Vultee and Convair.

Wednesday they will see a demonstration of helicopter flying at Bell Aircraft's plant at

Hurst. That night they will be the guests of Amon Carter, publisher of the Fort Worth Star Telegram, at his ranch.

Thursday they will shift headquarters to Dallas, touring Chance Vought Aircraft and Temco Aircraft Corporation plants en route. Dr. August Raspet of the University of Missouri will discuss theories of flight and Dr. Fred Weick of Texas A&M

College will talk on crop duster airplanes.

Chance Vought, Temco, Magnolia Petroleum, Dallas Airmotive and other aviation concerns will be hosts at a Thursday night party featuring a pistol shooting demonstration by Sheriff Jess Sweeten of Athens.

Friday morning the group will tour Love Field, including Southwest Airmotive, where executive-

type aircraft will be on exhibit.

The Dallas Times Herald and The Dallas Morning News will be hosts for a luncheon Friday at Brook Hollow Golf Club. A program on the master planning and development of Love Field will be presented by Stanley Marcus, Dallas Chamber of Commerce aviation committee chairman, and James C. Buckley, aviation consultant who surveyed the Love Field situation.

A national airport planning forum will follow, with members of the panel including Mr. Buckley, C. R. Smith, chairman of the board of American Airlines, Joseph D. Blatt, assistant administrator of the CAA, and Fred Glass, director of the avia-

tion department of the Port of New York Authority.

The closing banquet will begin at 8:30 p. m. Saturday. Conventioneers will have their choice

of a trip to Randolph Field at San Antonio, Temco Aircraft plant at Greenville or Collins Radio and Texas Instruments plants in Dallas.
