Myron G. Blalock, Democratic National Committeeman, from Marshall, Texas, sent me a telegram stating the Democratic National Committee is urgently calling for money for Congressional Campaign expenses and asking that I help by sending a check immediately.

I have just talked with Myron and told him that I would send you a check, as well as send him a copy of my letter. Meanwhile, I am enclosing a check for \$2,500.00.

Sid Richardson is down on St. Jo Island and I am unable to get in touch with him; however, I will include his name in this contribution and if I can get in contact with him I am sure he will want to send an additional check.

I was glad to have a talk with you and hope that everything will work out to your liking. Incidentally, I sent you a clipping from the Star-Telegram showing the deluge of cattle that poured into Fort Worth following the lifting of the OPA regulations. One day we had about 30,000 head. So, everybody should have meat soon and I hope the price will gradually readjust itself to where it will be in keeping with the expectation of the public.

The trouble we are having in our business now is getting sufficient paper to take care of our circulation as well as advertising. Meanwhile, they have just tilted the price \$10.00 a ton which means \$120,000.00 a year increase in our expenses.

I hope you are fine and we will have an opportunity to see you soon. Sid and I are still looking forward to a visit with you at St. Jo Island.
