Doc Miller hopes to see you very soon and get your reaction to these plans and to come to an agreement on the allocated costs.

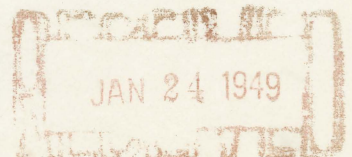
Sorry I missed you while you were east for the inaugural, but intend to be down in Fort Worth around the first of the month and spend a few days on Midway.
