In Butler's "Hudibras" we have a quotation like this, "Honor is but a word;" in contrast to this quotation we have another from Shakespeare, "Mine honor is my life; both grow in one; take honor from me, and my life is done." These two quotations express exactly the two positions which the students of T. C. U. can take in regard to the "Honor System" of the University, each student will of a necessity take his stand on one of the two positions during the "Fair Play" week, which the president of the student body, Thomas E. Dudney, has proclaimed.

Texas Christian University has entered the Southern Association of Colleges, having attained this honor to a great extent by the scholarship of its students; it has also become a member of the Southwestern Athletic Association, having achieved this place of honor by clean, and straightforward athletics. We are now placed before the educational world to act an honorable part in the advance of University ideals and desires, and we cannot do this successfully without full student self government. We cannot expect this honor until we, as students, prove ourselves worthy of the trust. Therefore, it is our duty to face the issue, and declare once and for all that the Student Body will no longer be cheated out of its inheritance of a full democratic government by a few unworthy and degenerate students. Let the book-stealer, the library robber, the cheater, the class-cutter and the disobedient, be assigned a place without the Student Body where they can no longer rob the school of its birthright of student government. Let the weakling, the pussy-footer, and the spineless that are convinced that the few have a right to destroy the rights of the whole, and cannot bear to tell the Student Honor Council the outrages that have been committed by the thief; let them lie away to some other clime, for we need them not. It is the brave, the courageous, and those that are willing to be students of the highest type that T. C. U. wants in her domain. In other words, those who are afraid to report a violation of the Honor System to the proper authorities are themselves a party to the crime and must bear the guilt. Students, it is our duty to make this Honor System a success; let us join as one and we shall succeed. Let us take as our motto the words that Lincoln wrote to Horace Greeley: "I shall do less whenever I believe what I am doing hurts the cause, and I shall do more when I shall believe doing more will help the cause."—W. 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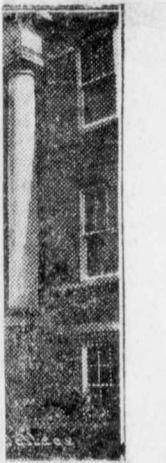

DR. LOCKHART SPOKE ON “BURIED CITIES”

Dr. Clinton Lockhart gave his lecture on “Buried Cities” to an audience of several hundred appreciative hearers in the chapel of the main building last Thursday evening, December 7th. Among the audience was a good number of town people mixed with the students.

The speaker was introduced by President Waits. He held the crowd's attention with a variety of jokes along with his subject, and he carried them with him through the oldest cities of history, Babylon, Nineveh, Ephesus, Jerusalem, and many other cities that played an important part in the ages before Christ, in Egypt, Greece, Rome, and in Palestine, gave up their secrets through the speaker, who has been on the grounds and watched the work of excavation, and who has translated much of the ancient records which were written on tablets of stone. Dr. Lockhart says that much information which throws light on the more or less discredited stories of the creation, the flood, and the exodus, is being gathered and given to the world; and more maybe hoped for as the work of discovery continues.

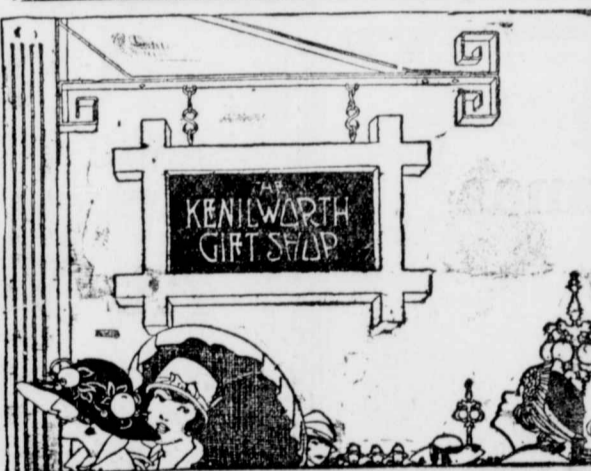
