Lt. Amon Carter Jr. Missing

**Publisher's Son Believed Captured
by Nazis in Tunisia**

WITH AMERICAN FORCES IN SOUTHERN TUNISIA, March 3 (Delayed) (A).—Second Lieutenant Amon G. Carter jr., son of a Fort Worth, Tex., publisher, has been reported missing in action while acting as a forward observer for a field artillery battalion, and is believed to be a prisoner of the Germans.

Lieutenant Carter, described by his superior officers as "a fine officer," was on duty at an advanced observation post on Lessouda Hill, facing the Faid Pass, when the Germans attacked on Feb. 14 in that region.

Lieutenant Carter's father is president and publisher of "The Fort Worth Star-Telegram."
