**1,100 APPLY FOR  
CLIPPER PLACES**

New York, Sept. 24.—Pan-American Airways today announced that more than 1,100 persons from all parts of the world had applied for passage on the clipper ships, which are scheduled to start passenger service between California, Hawaii and the Philippines on Oct. 21.

More than 400 of the applications are for accommodations on the initial flight. Reservations will be allotted, officials said, in the order of their receipt.

During the first three months, accommodations will be limited to seven passengers over the 2400-mile hop from San Francisco to Honolulu and Manila.

The late Will Rogers was No. 1 on the reservation list. Officials of the line said he handed them a blank check in 1932 and said:

“Here, I don’t know how much it’s going to be, but put me down and see and I get the first ticket.”

Then, referring to the Fort Worth newspaper publisher, he added:

“Put Amon Carter down, too. He wouldn’t miss a chance like that.”

Rogers’ check was returned to his estate after he was killed in an airplane crash with Wiley Post.

Carter was still on the list, but officials declined to say who the passengers on the first flight would be. They said one motion picture star, when advised that she was three hundred and nineteenth on the list offered to charter the clipper ship to assure a place on the inaugural flight.
