

FINAL EXAMINATION SCHEDULE - SPRING SEMESTER
May 21-26, 1951

Instructions

1. Each examination is scheduled for a period of two hours and should begin promptly on the hour assigned. Keep within the schedule. *
2. Instructors will hand their grades to the department heads (in duplicate) within 48 hours after each examination. The last grades are to reach the department heads not later than 8:00 A.M. Monday, May 28. These duplicate copies are then to reach the deans by 9:00 A.M. on that same date. The deans will retain one copy and will send one complete copy of the grades to the IBM Office by 10:00 A.M. that same day, Monday, May 28.
3. Teachers are urged to post grades outside their offices as the grades for each class are assigned. If you prefer to give your students numbers rather than to list the names with the grades, you may do so.
4. Students graduating, Monday, May 28, are to have their work completed by noon Wednesday the 23rd of May. These may take their final examinations at the regular exam periods through Wednesday, May 23. For all the other courses the instructors will need to make special arrangements for the examining of the graduating students in their respective classes. It is further suggested that the staff members wishing to make special arrangements for the examining of the graduating students should confer directly with the Dean of the College in which the specific course is being offered. GRADES ON GRADUATING STUDENTS MUST REACH THE IBM OFFICE NOT LATER THAN 2:00 P.M. the 24th on the special roll forms provided for that purpose.
