Dear Miss Ramsey:

In reply to your letter of February 5th, please be advised that my son, Aron G. Carter, Jr., is interned in Oflag 64, an American officer prisoner of war camp, which was located at Schubin in Poland about 100 miles south of Danzig. Senator Connally through the State Department was informed from Switzerland that this camp had been moved to Stalag No. 3-A located at Luckenwalde in the province of Brandenburg, Germany, about 30 to 35 miles south of Berlin.

Inasmuch as I know nothing about the camp you refer to, I regret not to be able to give you any information. Perhaps if you communicated with Senator Tom Connally he could give you this data as he gave me information about Oflag 64 since he knew that my son was in that particular camp. Inasmuch as there are quite a few Tomans in Oflag 64, the writer gave the information to the newspapers for the benefit of the next-of-kin and those interested in the American officers there.

The situation concerning the American prisoners of war in Germany is quite distressing at the present time, so let's hope and pray that these boys will all come through all right.
