Gentlemen:

Mr. Carter is in receipt of "next-of-kin" prisoner of war labels for his son who is a prisoner interned in Germany and this label is being forwarded herewith for the purpose of having you send the package of food.

We try to send some of the items he asks for that are on the permissible list and as much more highly concentrated food as possible. Therefore, under separate cover, we are sending you a package of muffin mix, pancake mix, 100 Multecebrin vitamin pills, a tooth brush, and three jars of Nescafe which I have emptied into a "push-in" tin and an empty tin can which you might want to pack something in. They are rather difficult to find, so I am sending this along., Also enclosed in the package is a leather bill fold.

These items weigh about three pounds and to finish the 11 pound package please add whatever is allowed of the following items: Cheese, powdered milk, chocolate, $\frac{1}{4}$ lb bouillon cubes, $\frac{1}{4}$ lb meat extrats, dried, Banana flakes, pre-cooked beans, sugar. If there is any additional items needed then use your own judgment.

Please return the attached list and instructions from the Provost Marshal General's office when you have gotten the desired information therefrom. You will note there are several items added and many changes in the articles this shipment.

Since, I do not know what the package will cost will you please apply it against Mr. Carter's credit balance with your organization and advise the amount so that it can be sent to you.
