Some Items of Interest.

Boarding costs \$3.00 per week. This includes furnished room, light and fuel. Good homes in private families can be secured when desired. Club and self boarding cost from \$1.50 to 2.00 per week. For this purpose unfurnished rooms can be secured at reasonable rates.

Students can enter at any time, but all are urged to be present at the beginning of the session. Come for the full session.—Come for a single term if it is the best you can do. But, if possible, come for the entire session; you can accomplish much in nine months.

We work on Saturday—thus gaining 36 days in the session. For this gain of time no extra charge is made.

We want working students.—If you are earnest and energetic in the great work of education, you will find here every opportunity desired. If you seek merely pastime or sport, go some where else; you will find no congenial spirits here.

ADVANTAGES.

There are many advantages to be obtained at this college rarely to be found. Among these we may name,

1. **THE LOCATION:** It is retired, amid the most beautiful scenery—pleasant hills and dales; and sparkling, running brooks; in a fine and health-giving atmosphere.

2. **THE STATE OF SOCIETY:** It is unsurpassed in moral bearing and social worth.

3. **THE DEPARTMENTS OF STUDY:** These embrace more than is commonly found at any one institution. Ample preparation is made for a Primary Department, in addition to the Preparatory and Classical. Vocal Music is an every day exercise. Instrumental Music, upon a variety of instruments, is taught to all who desire it. Painting, Drawing and Embroidery. German and French. Book keeping and Penmanship. And then we have a Normal Department, for the express purpose of training and qualifying teachers. Also, an Orphan De-

partment, for the special benefit of indigent orphans. And besides, we have a Bible Department, in which the Scriptures are thoroughly studied.

4. **THE LITERARY SOCIETIES:** There are several of these. They meet once each week. There are rooms specially prepared for their exercises, and one of the College faculty presides over the labors of each society.

5. **EXTRA TIME:** All the work-days of the week, including Saturday, are devoted to school exercises, thus gaining 36 days in the nine months' session.

6. **FAITHFUL WORK:** The Faculty are devoted workers. They put their whole affections, mind and strength into the work.

THE NEW BUILDING

Will be completed and ready for the opening of the Session. It is a large, three-story stone building, and well arranged for the accommodation of all the departments.

Our institution is becoming rapidly and favorably known. The attendance from abroad is a considerable increase over that of the previous session.

We invite all who feel an interest in education in Texas to visit our College, and examine into its merits, and become acquainted with its working, its situation and its surroundings.

Orphan Department.

At the last annual meeting of the Trustees an Orphan Department was adopted into AddRan College. The provisions for this Department are,

1. The interest arising from every \$333.33 donated to the Orphan fund and invested, shall pay for the tuition of one indigent Orphan in the regular College classes.

2. Any person or persons investing the full amount of a perpetual scholarship shall be privileged to select the orphan (and its successors) who shall receive the benefit of the donation.

3. This Department shall have one or more Trustees, who, in addition to the usual duties of Trustees, shall act as Financial Agents, for the receiving and prudent investment of the funds.

Gen. R. M. Gano was appointed Trustee and Financial Agent for the Orphan Department. All donations to the Orphan fund should be made through him.

BIBLE COURSE.

Inspiration, Hermanentics, Reason and Revelation; Latin, Greek, Hebrew; Metaphysics and Rhetoric; Homiletics in practice.

A critical study of the English may be substituted for Latin, Greek and Hebrew.

All students of every course will be in a literary society under the supervision of the teacher of the course.

In the Scientific course the French and German may be substituted for the Latin.

Remarks on Course of Studies.

THE PRIMARY DEPARTMENT.

The labor and responsibilities of this department require patient, vigilant and experienced teachers. The enrollment in this department during the past session has been unusually large, and the results quite satisfactory to teachers and parents. The President gave his personal and constant attention to this work. The present organization of the Faculty places the Vice President as principal of the Primary Department. He expects to associate with himself in this work a lady of tact and experience. AddRan College is a school for the people, and for the whole people; hence a curriculum embracing every ordinary educational want.

THE PREPARATORY COURSE.

It is the purpose of this Course to give a well grounded rudimental training, sufficient for the ordinary work of life, and preparatory to entering upon the Scientific or the Classical Course.

THE TEACHER'S COURSE

is intended for those who desire to prepare themselves for teaching in the common Schools, and its scope is a little more extended than the demands of such schools. There will be regular drills, and lectures on the Theory and Practice of Teaching, in this department. All students, even those of the highest grades, who expect to teach, will be drilled in this department. The President is Principal of the course.

The Scientific Course does not necessarily include the Latin, unless the pupil wishes to take the Classical Course.

The Bible Course is intended for young men preparing to preach the Gospel. The study of the Bible will be a prominent feature of the exercises of this Course. Colleges do not *make* preachers, but only help them to make themselves.

EXPENSES.

The College year is divided into two terms, of four and a half months each. The usual expenses, exclusive of Books, Clothes, &c., are as follows:

EXTRA CLASSES.

French, German, and Instrumental Music.—extra. Drawing, Painting, &c., at Teacher's price.

The expense of each term must be paid at the beginning of the term.

The children of Preachers regularly engaged in preaching, are admitted to all the privileges of the College free of tuition, except the Matriculation fee.

No student will be permitted to take lessons from any teacher disconnected with the College.

A scholarship, for FOUR YEARS, including every course of study, except the extra branches, can be purchased during the present year for EIGHTY DOLLARS. This offer is made in order to get means for immediate demands in buildings and apparatus.

A scholarship for FOUR YEARS, INCLUDING BOARDING, can be purchased, during the present year, for FOUR HUNDRED DOLLARS.

Parents are requested to forbid their children making accounts at the stores during their stay at college. It is impossible for teachers to prevent this when parents allow it. Any expense money, may be deposited with the Treasurer of the Board of Trustees, for safe keeping and proper use. The Treasurer will receipt for this money, and expend it according to direction of the parent or guardian.

If parents prefer to leave this matter entirely in the hands of their children, they must take the consequences. Some children can be trusted safely in this matter; others can not.

DRESS.

Simplicity, comfort and neatness are the important matters to be considered in a student's dress. All extravagance and superfluous ornamentation are discouraged in this college both by precept and example. While on the topic of *expenses*, we beg leave to call attention to the following statement, made by a christian gentleman of long experience and widely extended acquaintance and reputation:

"I have patronized the best colleges in Mississippi and Kentucky, and I have for two years patronized AddRan College. The expenses of the last, all things included, are less than half what they were at the other colleges, while the advancement in every thing that makes up the sum of a true education, has been much better at AddRan than at any of the others.

"The uniform *simplicity of dress* which prevails at AddRan is not a small factor in the reduction of expenses.

"But the crowning excellence of this College is the healthy moral and religious element that pervades the community through the influence of this Institution: I have never seen it equaled."

If additional facts and details are desired, the Secretary of the College will give the name of the writer of the above statements.

Terms of Admission.

1. Students must be of good moral character.
2. There must be a hearty endorsement of the article headed "Conduct of students," found below.
3. The required matriculation and tuition fees must be paid, except in cases of special arrangement.
4. A place of boarding must be selected with the advice and consent of the President or Vice President.
5. A course of study must be selected, with the advice and consent of the Faculty, sufficient for constant and rigorous work.

Conduct of Students.

It is presumed that every student will have some knowledge of the first principles of morality, propriety and decorum, and that it will therefore be unnecessary to prescribe a complete code of specific rules and regulations. But it will be expected and required of all students:—

1. That they be diligent in their study, punctual in their attendance upon worship, recitations, examinations and all other college exercises, and that they promptly render a valid and satisfactory reason to the proper officers for any delinquency.
2. That they treat all persons, and especially the students and teachers of the college, with becoming respect.
3. That they do not trespass upon the premises of any person, and

they in no way deface or injure the property of the college.

4. That they attend no exhibition of immoral tendency; no race course, billiard-saloon, bar room, or tipping house.

5. That they neither introduce upon the premises of the college, nor use there or elsewhere, any kind of intoxicating beverage; and that they abstain from the use of tobacco in the college.

6. That they neither keep in their possession nor use any fire-arms, a dirk, a bowie-knife, nor any other kind of deadly weapon.

7. That they abstain from profanity, the desecration of the Lord's day, all kinds of gaming for a reward or prize of any kind, and from card playing even for amusement; and also whatever else is inconsistent with good order, good taste, and good morals.

8. That they attend public worship every Lord's day.

9. That they do not leave the college until regularly dismissed at the close of the session, without the special permission of the Faculty.

10. That they do not change their place of boarding without the permission of the Faculty.

11. That they shun and discountenance all disorderly combinations and associations of students or citizens; and that they co-operate with the Faculty in every honorable way to promote the interest and reputation of the college.

Graduation.

Certificates of Graduation will be granted to those students who honorably complete the studies embraced in any Department.

Appropriate Degrees are conferred on those who honorably complete the Scientific, the Classical or the Bible Course.

A fee of *three dollars* is charged for a Certificate, and a fee of *ten dollars* for a Diploma. A Diploma is however, granted free of charge to those holding Department certificates.

All necessary powers are conferred, and the rights of the Alumni secured, by a liberal charter. Critical examinations of the candidates for graduation are held in the presence of the Faculty and Trustees of the College. No Certificate or Diploma will be granted unless the examination is satisfactory, and the deportment of the pupil good.
