Mrs. Antrim and I were happy to note a news item today, indicating that you had received word that Ammon Jr. was alive, and we hope will receive kind treatment at the hands of the Germans.

We learned through the news papers some time ago that he was missing, and our thoughts and wishes have been most sincere that he would survive and have good care.

We are writing Jack of the news and he will be glad to hear of Ammon. He is stationed in the Canal Zone. His address is, Lt. Jack C. Antrim, O-416204, Div. Eng. XAD, APO 834, %Postmaster, New Orleans, La. If Ammon can be reached by letter through the Red Cross, I am sure Jack will want to write him.

Our older son, Joe is 1st Lt. in the air service, and received his wings on Nov. 10, 1942. He is now taking some special training at Orlando, Fla.

Our daughter, Sarah died in Rome, Italy Jan. 7, 1942, following an operation for appendicitis. Her husband was 3rd Sec. in the U.S. Embassy there.
