Dear Cowboy:

Katrine called me over the 'phone before I left the house this morning and read your letter to her dated January 27th and postmarked February 1st, examined and passed by Censor 4613. We were all excited and tickled pink to hear from you as it is the first letter we have had since January 19th, although your Mother told Katrine she had a letter dated January 21st. I am hoping that I will get a letter sometime during the day.

I wrote you a long letter last night at the Fort Worth Club in long hand and I hope you will be able to read it. I sent you one of the pictures which I like best that you have made, although all of them are "swell". Katrine has already sent Ruth a complete set of all the pictures, including those I am in and has sent your Mother a complete set of everything I am not in.

Katrine will answer her letter direct but I had already sent a set of pictures to you and I would send a set to Jean except that Katrine says you asked her not to send any more pictures, that you wanted to send them yourself and, of course, we are delighted to comply with any request you might make. Hence we are not sending a complete set - just those that I made. The only reason that I would have liked to have sent them to Jean is the fact that if you have to wait until you get them and then send them back it will take from three to four months before they get to her. Meanwhile, as stated it is our desire to handle them as you say.

There is nothing in Katrine's letter to indicate that you have had letters dated later than December 8th from Fort Worth. When you do receive them it will probably take a week to read all of them, meanwhile, I am inclined to think you have received mail by this time.

Enclosed you will find a copy of a letter from Frank Walker, Postmaster General in Washington, regarding the African mail. This is a follow-up in regard to my previous telegram complaining about the mail service to the boys in Africa.

We are still anxious to know if you have received any of the cables we have sent from here.

Mr. Greene was just in the office and arranged to show a part of the movie films this afternoon to Sidney Wiederman's wife and mother. As requested by you, as soon as we receive the others back from Eastman, we will have Jean over and show her all of the pictures.

I just had a letter from Ruth and she is fine.

Raymond Buck came by the house this morning and left me a nice country ham and a stocking full of homemade, country, sausage. I am sorry you cannot be here to participate in the eating of this food. In any event, we hope to have a supply for your return.

The Amon Carter Riverside High School Basket Ball Team has won the city championship.

As told you in a previous letter, your last \$3,000.00 in bonds have been received. As suggested in my previous letter, also, it might not be a bad idea for you to permit us to buy bonds for most of your bank balance. I have asked Katrine to suggest to you that you give her "Power-of-Attorney" (or me) to look after these things for you during your absence. We will send you a blank provided you want to do so. If not, it is entirely all right. We have no desire to take over the management of your affairs other than to the extent that it might facilitate matters in doing things that you want done without unusual delays. This would permit Katrine to go ahead and file your Income Tax Report; however you will have sufficient time - I think six months after the war is over to file it.

We are naturally reading the papers eagerly every day for all the reports. So far they have not been very encouraging and we are all banking on your crowd, when thoroughly organized and lined up, to make a good showing.
