Campus celebration planned for Tuckers

THE TCU COMMUNITY IS INVITED TO an informal celebration from 3-5 p.m. April 21 in front of the Student Center honoring Chancellor Bill Tucker and his wife, Jean. The "Thanks for the Memories" lawn party will include free refreshments.

Additionally on May 26, a final "Thanks for the Memories" event will be held for community and business leaders on campus.

March 27 is the dedication of the Mary D. and F. Howard Walsh Center for Performing Arts. That night at the Worthington Hotel, the Tuckers will be honored at an invitation-only gala.

The black-tie event will celebrate the Chancellor's contributions to TCU, his impact on the community and the memories made along the way.

The invitation list consists of friends of the Tuckers, the Board of Trustees, and significant campaign donors. The Concert Chorale, Strolling Strings and the String Quartet are scheduled to perform during the evening.

Various campaign speakers and Board of Trustee members are also expected to add remarks on behalf of the campaign and the Tuckers. ♦

Writing Center to present reading by Miller Williams

THE WILLIAM L. ADAMS WRITING Center will present a reading by Inaugural Poet Miller Williams at 3:30 p.m. March 26 in the Student Center ballroom. The reading is made possible by a grant from the King Foundation.

Williams was commissioned to craft a poem for President Clinton's second inauguration following in the footsteps of past inaugural poets Robert Frost and Maya Angelou. The poem Williams wrote for the occasion, "Of History and Hope," traces the path of the American people - where they have been and where they might go.

Williams is a professor of English at the University of Arkansas and former director of the University of Arkansas Press.

He is the author of 27 books including *The Ways We Touch*, which includes the "Inaugural Poem;" *Points of Departure* and *Living on the Surface: New and Selected Poems*. ♦
