#### Monday, 2.

Reopening of school after holidays. Attendance good. Some 15 or 20 new pupils. An overflow in primary dept.

#### Tuesday, 3.

Bright, beautiful day. School in good plight. Several other additions.

Am allowing myself to be worried some over the “boarding house” troubles. Rheumatic foot also worrying me.

#### 4. Wednesday 4.

Organize 2<sup>nd</sup> Bible Class this 7. P.M. Some 15 in class. Adopt Dawlings Normal Book No. 4 for class use.

#### 8. Sunday

At home. Preach from 1<sup>st</sup> Cor. 3:21-23. The Christian’s Possessions. Officers’ meeting at 2:30 P.M. C.E. at 7- Sermon at 7:30. “How Do I Know That I am a Child of God?” Rom. 8:16; 1<sup>st</sup> John 3:14. Write to Zemula tonight.

#### 9. Monday 9-

Beginning of 5<sup>th</sup> month of the session. Clear and bright in forenoon. Clouds up and turns cooler in P.M.

#### 10. Tuesday.

Slow rain most all day, including after night.

#### 11 Wednesday 11

Rainy most of the day. Turns cold after dark. \_\_\_\_\_ turn out to the Normal Bible Class.

#### 12. Thursday 12

Heavy sleet. Very cold. Primary attendance at school quite small.

#### 13 Friday

Still very cold. Sleet all over the ground yet.

14. Saturday

Little warmer today. Considerable thawing. Very slippery. Letter from home today – first of the week.

15. Sunday 15

Cold bright day. Walked to Granbury. Small attendance at S.S. and church. Small at C.E. Took dinner with bro. Dean. Better audience at night. Subject of morning sermon – John 1 Nathaniel's Confession (Jno. 1:49) Evening. Andrew's Work (Jno 1: 41,42) Brethren \_\_\_\_ me home by livery rig.

16 Monday

Cold. Appearance of rain. Rains at night.

17 Tuesday 17

Bro. Randolph stopes by over night. Raining tonight. \_\_\_\_ is beginning to work on barn.

18. Wednesday 18

Clear, pretty day – just a little cool. Bro. R. leaves this evening for Stephenville. Increase in my Wednesday night Bible class.

19. Thursday

Beautiful spring-like day. Get Justice to haul lumber for barn. Earl helps today in barn. Mrs. Curtis lectures tonight – W.C.T.U. woman.

20 Friday 20

Weather still beautiful. Some additions to class in English Literature. Work on barn progressing.

21. Saturday. 21

Go to Granbury – pay tax on this home place \$5.00 Call on Sister Hannaford. Receive \$8.50 on salary. Order cards printed.

22. Sunday. 22

Cold, cloudy, misty weather today. Bro. Mason preaches at 11 a.m. and 7 P.M. Morning sermon. Jno. 4. Evening Eph2:8.

23. Monday 23

Restless night, not feeling well this morning. Have to give up work and go to bed afternoon. Something like la gripe. Very bilious. Pretty sick all night. Letters from home and Carl today.

24. Tuesday 24

Still in bed, worried by callers. Taking medicine. No appetite. Surrender to the inevitable. Don't remember to have ever had to give up school work on account of sickness of self before. Earl stays with me tonight.

25 Wednesday 25

No improvement apparent. Keep at the medicine and \_\_\_\_\_. Dr. Lancaster calls to see me this P.M. and leave prescription.

26 Thursday 26

Very cold weather. Thermometer about 16. Little appetite. Take little soup. Get Dr. L.'s pre. filled and begin to take it. Not much sleep tonight. Earl slept with me and coughed nearly all night. No, this was last night. E. went down home tonight and I rested pretty well after midnight.

27 Friday 27

Feeling better. Bright pretty day. Cool, but clear. Taking the Dr. L. medicine. Rest very well tonight. Sit up a little this P.M.

28 Saturday 28

Up most of the day. Go to Ida's for dinner. Am very weak. Walk down again for supper. Sleep very soundly tonight.

29 Sunday 29

Due at Stephenville today. Not well enough to go. Stay in my room all day. First Sunday in my recollection that I have been kept away from the Home of the Lord on account of sickness.

30 Monday 30

At school, but quite poorly. Cold and cloudy weather. Woman comes with two horses and surrey.

31 Tuesday 31

Cold, drizzly weather. Administer very first flogging of the session to S. McCain.

1 Feb. 1

Cold, wet day. Very few at Bible class tonight.

2 Thursday 2

Elmer Swinney goes home not in good health. Sorry to lose him from school. Weather much colder-sleet covering the ground.

3 Friday 3

Weather worse. Few at school. Dismiss at noon.

4 Saturday 4

Weather still very bad. Moderates a little in P.M. but turns cold in night.

5 Sunday 5

Still quite cold and cloudy- go to preaching- Small audience, but very pleasant meeting. Dine at Dr. Hanneford's. Return in afternoon. A very cold night.

February

6 Monday 6

An extremely cold morning. Omit chapel – wood very scarce. \_\_\_\_ 30 \_\_\_\_ and close at 1 P.M. Send \_\_\_\_ out about 60 and a considerable than far from home. Clouds up in afternoon. Begins flurrying again. Letter from Jessie. Doing well.

7 Tuesday 7



Still very cold. Run on short schedule. Misting and freezing all day.

8 Wednesday 8

Warmer. Thawing some. Faculty meeting for reports after school.

9 Thursday 9

Resume the regular schedule. Not many at school. Rapid thaw. Streams of water. The Morrow family move into the house.

10 Friday 10

Not so warm on yesterday. Cloudy in afternoon. Quite a number still absent from school. Some sick. Others indifferent.

11 Saturday 11

Drizzling rain most of the day. Card from Carl Tilby of the offer made him to take position in T.C.U.

12 Sunday 12

An awful day. Close to zero with a gale from the north thick with sleet. No exercises today. A very cold night. Coldest of the winter and are cold as any winter in this country.

13 Monday 13

Very cold. Ran on short schedule at College. A very cold night.

14 Tuesday 14

Moderated some. Weather clear, wind from south until noon, then changed to north and colder. Calm at night. Hope for pleasant weather tomorrow. Feeling quite well tonight. Had good beef steak at Ida's for supper. Wrote to Cousin Phebe Newcomer tonight.

15 Wednesday 15

Weather clear and bright, but cool. Distribute monthly reports of last period.

16 Thursday 16

Cloudy today. Rains and slets tonight.

17 Friday 17

Damp drizzly day. Slow rain mixed with sleet all night.

18 Saturday 18

Miserably ugly weather. Ground covered with sleet. Drizzling all day. Freezing and thawing alternately.

19 Sunday 19

Cloudy and slushy. Walk to Granbury. A very muddy walk, but few out. Not a S.S. officer, except secty. Only one male member- Prof. Jones. No apt for night. Prof. Jones brings me home in his buggy.

20 Monday 20

Very sloppy. Sun shines out. Randolph comes.

21 Tuesday

Pretty day- Holloway & Mary Clark come.

22 Wednesday 22

Washington's Birth Day. Give holiday. Baseball team go to Godley for game. Holloway R. & I walk around and talk over school matters. Beautiful weather.

23 Thursday 23

Holloway returns to Cleburne. Beautiful weather.

24 Friday 24

Bro. R. starts for Lancaster. Weather warm and beautiful. Elocution & Music give entertainment tonight – good. Turns cooler – light norther.

25 Saturday 25

Pretty day – just a little cool. Go to Granbury and purchased some articles of clothing. Pay the Hd. W. Co. for cistern, gutting &c. \$58.50.

26 Sunday 26

At home. Good S.S. Good audience at preaching. Sermon from Rom. 1:14. Subject- "The Church's Debt to the World" Officers meeting at 2:30 P.M. Elect bro. Baum sect'y in place of Geo. Scott resigned. Decide to have a protracted meeting in April. At night fair audience "The Judgement," the subject. Ecl. 12: 13; Rom. 14:12; 2<sup>nd</sup> Cor. 5:10

27 Monday 27

Weather still very fine. Good attendance at school. Everything moving along smoothly. Faculty meeting at 4 P.M. Buck Canony & Moris questioned about their difficulty.

28 Tuesday 28

Buy lot of fruit trees from Baker of Granbury.

March

1 Wednesday 1

Very warm and beautiful weather.

2 Thursday 2

Can get no one to put out my trees. Begin to put them out myself after school.

3 Friday 3

At work on my trees

4 Saturday 4

Inauguration Day. Employ Gaither Brown to help me put out the trees. Put out about 60 before 3 o'clock, and grub up a lot of old peach tree stumps.

5 Sunday 5

At Granbury- Small audience. Preach missionary sermon – Rom. 1:14. Dine with Proj. Jones. C.E. at 4:30. Sup with bro. Stapp. Sermon at night on The Judgement. Better audience than in the morning. Foreign Mission Day. Offering at Thorp & Granbury #13.25 at T.S. about 10 at G.

6 Monday 6

Nothing out of the usual.

7 Tuesday 7

The Morrow family move out of my house into their own. The Geo. Scott place.

8 Wednesday 8

Letter from Sallie. Trouble over my proposal to move. Raining today and most of the night slowly. Write home for them not to come, if it is best for them to stay at Amarillo. Will try to endure this \_\_\_\_\_ another year.

9 Thursday 9

Cooler. Need fires at college. Clears up and \_\_\_\_ bright and spring like.

10 Friday 10

Frost this morning. Bright, beautiful day. Entertainment at college tonight," Mock Faculty Meeting". Very humorous.

11 Saturday 11

Gaither Brown and I finish the old orchard clearing, burn the brush. Got through by 10 A.M. Some rain today, and is raining tonight gently.

12 Sunday 12

At home. Preach ~~morning~~ and night. "The Liberty of the Truth" John 8:32.

13 Monday 13

Holloway comes with his family this evening.

14 Tuesday 14

Bro. Randolph comes this evening. Holloway gets into the Father place, which he now owns. Rains most of the night. Had my old orchard ploughed today.

15 Wednesday 15

Raining most of the day. New cistern fills up and runs over. Card from Carlton.

16 Thursday 16

Very muddy after the rain. Bro. R. made talk in chapel. Bro. R. and Holloway go to Granbury to see bro. Stapp about going in school with us.

17 Friday 17

Cloudy, east wind. Rains by spells in P.M. Comes up hard rain with some wind from N.W. after night. Sleep with bro. R. at Holloway's. Stapp goes in with us.

18 Saturday 18

Bright, beautiful day. Bro. R. goes to his apt at Arlington. Letters from Roy & Zema.

19 Sunday 19

At Granbury. S.S. small. Audience at preaching not large. Sermon: Christianity's Greatest Argument. Matt. 7:20, Jno. 10:38. Mrs. Katie Nunnally Kerr united and bro. Davis. Took dinner at Prothro's at new home. Night audience little better. Sermon on Character Building. 2<sup>nd</sup> Peter 1. Dr. Prothro brings me home.

20 Monday 20

Toothache all day. Receive letter from Bro. G.A. Faris offering the presidency of Hereford College at \$1200. Decline much against my personal interest. Retire early. Suffering with tooth and head.

21 Tuesday 21

Awakened by alarm of fire about 1 a.m. Look out and see the College on fire. No chance to save it. Start and see those massive buildings gutted by the alarming flames. Nothing saved but few books and few desks – and two pianos. Believed to be the work of an incendiary. Mass meeting tonight at Girls' Home. Some good and brave talks. All seem determined to rebuild. Committee appointed to go over and see Maj. Jarvis, Randolph Holloway, & A.G. Dabney appointed. Announce for school to assemble next morning.

22 Wednesday 22

Assemble in dining hall of Girls' Home. Dismiss for the day to get ready for work tomorrow. Fit up the Rock House. Most of the pupils readily adjust themselves to the condition of affairs. Randolph & Holloway return with sufficient encouragement to justify over proceeding to plan for new building.

23 Thursday 23

Resume work. Use dining hall of Girls' Home for assembly \_\_\_\_\_. Clean room at Rock House.

24 Friday 24

Dismiss school on account of court of investigation about burning.

25 Saturday 25

Court reconvened. Examining witnesses.

26 Sunday 26

No place to meet today. Some of us go to pecan grove for outing. Beautiful day. Enjoyable time. Have religious service in afternoon. Return home by 6 o'clock.

27 Monday 27

Dunlap moves out of the Girls' Home into Rock House. Move drills and \_\_\_\_\_ into the Girls' Home.

28 Tuesday 28

Reopen school in Girls' Home. Dunlap out of school.

29 Wednesday 29

All quiet at school. Pupils dropping out. Work goes on in good order.

30 Thursday 30

Pretty weather. A little cool.

31 Friday 31

Ball game with Tarleton at 3:30 – 4 to 2 in favor of T. Ladies give tea at night. Good crowd.

Sat. April 1

Rains all day and most of the night. Letter from home.

2 Sunday 2

4 Tuesday 4

5 Wednesday 5

Cool norther all day. Warmer toward night. Pretty cool night – nearly frost.

6 Thursday 6

Much warmer today. Beautiful weather. Bro. R. returns from Stephenville. Holloway has meeting with the prominent me of the place about the college matter.

7 Friday 7

24 Monday 24
