There seems to be a lot of confusion in the matter of handling the scrap rubber shipments PERIOD One of the smaller oil companies has already accumulated one million pounds and has been unable to find out what to do with it PERIOD The Chamber of Commerce wired the four brokers: one in Akron, one in Chicago and two in New York, asking for instructions as to where to ship the rubber PERIOD They wired back and asked them to get in touch with the Petroleum Industry in Washington PERIOD This delay of not having shipping instructions is going to materially affect the total amount as rubber is a fire hazard and it will slow down the filling stations if they do not find immediate relief for getting rid of the accumulation of rubber PERIOD I am passing this along to you as there certainly should be some action on it immediately to avoid retarding the plan.
