Dear Mrs. Batte:

You have been so nice to keep Mr. Carter informed of the mail you have received from your husband who is interned in Oflag 64, Germany, and we have received so little that I haven't taken the time to write you.

Mr. Carter received a letter dated May 10, and then a couple of weeks ago a card dated June 12 and last Saturday a card dated July 31 arrived, none of which told us anything of any importance other than that he was getting along fine, the weather was better, he is weighing 165 pounds now, and he said that he was taking a lot of exercise and getting his feet in condition. This we interpret to mean that they think they might be moved and will have to march to the new location.

Incidentally, Mrs. Emerson of Handley received a letter from her husband dated August 7, which is the last information we know that has come out of that particular camp.

If you hear anything new, Mr. Carter will appreciate hearing from you and we, in turn, will communicate with you.
