Dear Mrs. Cannon:

Your letter of December 13 concerning sending packages to your son, who is a prisoner of war in the same camp with Amon Junior, has been received.

I do not know what your son meant by his statement that Mr. Carter would send you a letter telling you how to mail him packages, as there is only one way to send packages to prisoners of war, and that is with the official label sent from the War Department every 60 days. A list from which you may choose the items to be sent is attached to the label. In packing our parcels to send Mr. Carter's son, we take into consideration the items he requests, the items furnished by the Red Cross and those on the permissible list and send what seems to us the most practical from these three sources to go in the eleven pound package every 60 days.

If you will ask your local Red Cross Chapter to furnish you their monthly bulletin, it will also help you to prepare your packages. If there is any further information we can give you, please let us know.
