The teachers are responding splendidly to the request for grades within forty-eight hours after examinations. We appreciate this expression of cooperation very much indeed. It enables the Registrar's Office and the IBM Office to get much of the detail out of the way before registration.

## AN ITEM OF CAUTION

In the pressure of getting final grades for those students transferring to other institutions we have given permission for a few students to bring from their teachers shortly after examinations a report of the final grade. These were to come in sealed envelopes. Some students have over-stepped their privilege in this regard and have told certain teachers that they were given permission to take an early examination. This is a mis-representation. No teacher is permitted to give a final examination out of the regular schedule announced without a written permit from the Registrar's Office on a "Special Examination" form provided for this purpose. Require this permit before you give the examination.

At the close of each semester there are always "I" grades. The student has thirty days within the semester immediately following to clear this "I". Before you receive any make-up work or give an examination toward clearing these "I" grades the student must present to you a "Removal of I" slip properly filled out in the Registrar's Office. The office will determine whether or not the \$2 fee is to be paid. This will show on the permit you will receive

Please arrange for one person in each Department to remain at the close of each period until the last student is cleared through the checking table.
5. The total procedure has been reduced to the minimum. Thank you, one and all, for your loyal and cooperative help.
6. Mr. Hugh Eckols will be in charge of the line of registration with a competent staff to assist in the process.
