My family left Fort Worth in 1906, and except for short visits years ago, have not been back. On one of my trips through there about five years ago, our old home had been torn down and a big hospital occupied the site. If you are a younger generation Monnig, you will remember the place as the C.A. O'Keefe home, as we sold it to them when we first left Fort Worth. It was 520 Hill St.

I am Will T. Scott, and Sara is my daughter. I assist her in the agate business, as I am retired from business. Sara is making her hobby, rock-hounding, pay her expenses thru State College. We have collected agate for years, but never attempted to commercialize our hobby until about a year ago. We just returned from a trip thru Arizona, N. Mex., Texas and into Mexico, where we bought several tons of exceptional agate. We also attended the "round-up" on the Woodward ranch near Alpine. I note with interest your work with meteorites, as I have been long interested in them myself. I have visited Niningers and of course the crater near Holbrook. Have gone to the Midland, Texas crater. Have had correspondance with Dr. Lincoln LaPaz at Santa Fe regarding a crater which I have known of for many years. I am positive that the crater is of meteoric orign, as the surface indications all point to it. Strata is all tilted away from the point of impact, circular form is about mile across. The center of the crater is filled with rubble, and a lot of it is metmorphosed sand stone and limestone, changed to marble and so on by pressure and heat. In case you are interested enough to visit the spot, here's how you find it. Go west on highway 80 to the town of Colorado City, Mitchell Co. Take the paved road which turns left (South) at a stop-light in ColoradoCity. This road goes to Sterling City and San Angelo. About fifteen od so miles on this road you come to the bridge across Beals Creek. Check this on any road map. Turn around and head back toward Colorado City. About a mile from the bridge, more or less, on your right, to the East, you will see the low mound which is the crater. It is about 200 yards from the road, and is across the fence in the Spade Ranch. I have been there many times, and have never seen a "Keep-Out" sign. Incidentally, the 65,000 acres which is across the road to the West here, was my family's ranch. We do not own itnow, altho we do have the mineral rights to a lot of it. There is some pretty good production in the West end, about 14 miles from the road-
