SATURDAY, MAY 1 IS THE DEADLINE FOR nominating an individual for The Chancellor's Staff Award for Outstanding Service. This annual recognition goes to a staff member (exempt or non-exempt) for exemplary service to the University and the University community.

For your convenience, the nomination form can now be accessed online at www.chancellor.tcu.edu/nomform.asp. Also outlined there are the criteria for eligibility as a nominee, as well as details of the selection process.

By July 1, finalists will be selected from each of seven divisions (Provost and Academic Affairs, Student Affairs, Finance and Administration, Marketing and Communication, University Advancement, Intercollegiate Athletics and Brite). Chancellor Boschini will select the recipient, and finalists and recipient will be recognized at the Opening Day Luncheon on Aug. 24 in Daniel-Meyer Coliseum.

The recipient of The Chancellor's Staff Award for Outstanding Service will receive a monetary award, and his or her picture will become part of a permanent display. Each division finalist also will receive a monetary award. ♦

Stacey Floyd-Thomas receives double honors at Brite awards event

STACEY M. FLOYD-THOMAS, ASSISTANT professor of Ethics and Black Church Studies at Brite Divinity School, took home both faculty honors presented last week at the annual Brite Awards Luncheon.

She was the recipient of the Catherine Saylor Hill Endowed Faculty Excellence Award, selected annually by written vote of the Brite faculty. It recognizes excellence in the areas of teaching, scholarship and service. She also received the Louise Clark Brittan Endowed Teaching Award given by the Brite student body to recognize superlative teaching performance. Each award carries with it a \$3,000 stipend.

Stacey has been at Brite since fall 2002. A 1991 graduate of Vassar College, she has master's degrees from Candler School of Theology at Emory University and from Temple University and a Ph.D. degree in philosophy in religion from Temple University. ♦

Monica Kintigh (counseling center) reminds that the sessions are free to TCU faculty and staff, \$100 to outside participants. The class size is 20. "Participation in this workshop provides the non-professional with the tools to recognize and estimate risk, and become more effective in helping people who are at risk of attempting suicide."

It is suitable for faculty, university support staff, counselors, mental health professionals, nurses, physicians, police, clergy and community volunteers.
