ACCLAIMED NATIONAL SPORTSWRITER AND TCU alumnus Dan Jenkins will be the honored guest for a Friends of the TCU Library event at 7 p.m. Tuesday, May 10 in the Cox ballroom of the Kelly Center.

A native of Fort Worth, Jenkins was a Horned Frog golfer while at TCU and went on to cover more major championships for newspapers and magazines than anyone who has ever written about the sport. The recent Masters tournament was his 55th consecutive visit there. It soon will be his 53rd U.S. Open, his 49th PGA and his 34th British Open.

Jenkins has also written 17 books, including *Semi-Tough* and *Dead Solid Perfect*. His latest novel, titled *Slim and None*, is just out from Doubleday and will be available for signing at this event.

Multi-faith Holocaust remembrance set for May 5

THE JEWISH FEDERATION OF FORT WORTH and Tarrant County will host Yom HaShoah/Holocaust Memorial Day, a multi-faith community remembrance, at 7 p.m. Thursday in PepsiCo Recital Hall. This year marks the 60th anniversary of the Holocaust.

The program will include the lighting of candles by Holocaust survivors, readings by **Rev. Angela Kaufman** (University minister); Rabbi Ralph Mecklenburger of Congregation Beth-El, Rabbi Ned Soltz of Congregation Beth Shalom, Rabbi Alberto Zeilicovich of Congregation Ahavath Sholom, Rev. Dick Lord of Rush Creek Christian Church and Imam Masjid Moujahed Bakhach of Al-Hedayah.

In addition, there will be a performance by New York actress Naava Piatka, creator of a one-woman musical play that pays tribute to her late mother, Chayela Rosenthal, a Yiddish actress, comedienne and survivor. *Finding My Mother's Voice* blends humor and song to capture both Rosenthal's exuberant spirit and the overwhelming losses she experienced in Nazi Germany. Dr. Javier Smolarz of Congregation Ahavath Sholom will sing a cantorial solo.

The event is open to the public, free of charge, and the entire community is invited to attend. ♦
