Enclosed you will find a photostatic copy of a letter received from John A. Burrows in which he discusses the Tideland Bill and also says he has a Government of Texas \$10.00 note issued December 7, 1836 by President Lamar, the first President of Texas.

He wonders if Mr. Truman would take the note up at compound interest of ten percent. Figuring this up, the ten dollar note would now be worth \$633,215.37. This, of course, has nothing to do with the Tideland Bill, but it does show the gentleman's opinion regarding the President's action on the Tideland case.
