Dear Katrine,

As I have no records of the initial contract with Quattrocchi, I cannot figure out the difference to which you refer. I can only tell you that on April 30, 1948, I paid Quattrocchi \$2,850.00 and July 19, 1948, \$420.50. The enclosed letter from Quattrocchi is the one he sent in place of the receipt I requested. It is sufficient, in that it states that all 'payments in connection with the casting in bronze, etc.,' have been paid. If your books show an additional \$100 due, I really cannot say to whom. (what horrible English).

As to the bill showing the commission: Mr. Carter told Mrs. Biggs that he would allow her \$500 for seeing the thing done properly, naturally I, as secretary, took over the job. I promised when I resigned to see the thing through and have done so. If Mr. Carter still wishes to pay a commission for the agent, that is up to him. The bill states the commission paid but that is merely for tax purposes, Mr. Carter said he wanted such a statement for the record, so I sent it.

Do you never light in one place? I am sure glad it is not me. Thanks for the check, I had to borrow a bit to make the last payment and am glad to be able to return it so promptly.

A last thought, I can call Electra and ask her what the price quoted was but I doubt if she will remember. Let me know if there is anything further I can do. I'll write Mr. Carter on the epergnes later on. Love and stuff,
