## RUSSIA CRITICIZES CIVIL AVIATION PLAN

### Free and Unregulated Flights Are Held Source of Danger

MOSCOW, June 19—An influential Soviet journal today criticized post-war proposals for freedom of the air. In an article in War and the Working Class Prof. A. Voskresensky said that such a principle had "real possibilities of harming the security of separate countries" and could not be compared with the age-old freedom of the seas because it was broader.

"Free and unregulated flights over foreign countries are the opening for big possibilities of misuse and aggression against the national interests of separate States—possibilities of reconnaissance and spying, of violating customs and other frontier rules," Professor Voskresensky said.

The article was published at the time the Soviet post-war delegation is in Washington discussing proposals for an international organization on civil aviation. The article said that no plan for international post-war civil aviation can succeed unless there is a "correct understanding of and consideration of the interests and role of the Soviet Union."
