I have just today received clippings and information that Amon, Jr. is a prisoner of war in Germany. Of course, I was hoping and praying that this would probably be the case, and that he had been captured when the Germans made their surprise attack in the early part of the Tunisian Battle. Needless to say this is a great relief to you and likewise, to all of your friends.

Of course I can see young Amon pulling on the bit and raring to get away and back into the fight, but that will have to take care of itself. At least he is safe and sound and saved for another day.

My boy as you probably know, is Paratrooper Officer at Fort Benning. Since his graduation he has trained two companies of paratrooper recruits. He paid his last visit to me this last Sunday and is now standing by in a restricted area at Fort Benning in one of the last groups to be shipped away by units for the last three weeks. They know not where they will go, but they think for North Africa.

It is a great life if you don't weaken. We can only hope and pray and carry on back home.

I have been in Atlanta almost constantly for two months but am leaving here Sunday to spend the month of May in Washington. They haven't done anything on the tax plan since I left and I thought I had better get back where I could at least listen in. Let me know if you are coming toward New York or Washington.
