I received the news about Amou from June the day they surrendered to us here. It really made the day for me. I know that he will take care of himself and be returned to you Ok. I'm sorry he couldn't have been with us in the last few battles - you would have had to pay him a small fortune on the basis you'd agreed upon before he left England.

Things are not too bright for us now that the fighting is over. There's nothing to do & no place to do it. We feel like the forgotten soldier. It's hot & we still have winter uniforms. Everything is off limits for our men. The mail is particularly bad
