# Lt. Amon Carter Freed From Camp by Russians.

EAST OF THE ELBE WITH THE RUSSIAN ARMIES, May 2.—Three prisoners of war from Luckenwalde reported today that Lt. Amon G. Carter, son of the Fort Worth (Tex.) publisher, was alive and well and had been liberated by the Russian advance.

"Carter was in charge of distributing Red Cross parcels, and when I saw him last yesterday he was in good shape and was staying in the Luckenwalde camp in compliance with the senior American officer's order that prisoners stay there until arrangements are made for them," said Lt. Henry N. Crellin of Springfield, Ohio.

Lt. Crellin reached American lines with Lt. Robert H. Harvey, Chicago, and Lt. Lewis L. Dalofie, Natrona Heights, Pa.

Lt. Crellin was captured in Metz last October from the 5th Division. Lt. Harvey, a Flying Fortress navigator, was shot down over Berlin last June. Lt. Dalofie was captured from the 103d Division in December.
