We are just beginning to reap

leave Sunday and start here  
Tuesday being ready here  
Monday. You will get this  
about 4 o'clock Sat.; and if  
you want me to come here at  
once, have one of the boys to go  
to Greenburg and wire me to  
come. I will get the word in  
time to start that night and  
get here Sunday. I fear that  
some of the rest of you may  
take the fever. What caused  
here caused it with Z. & B. & R.  
I wonder? Taking at the same  
time looks very much like it  
was caused in both cases by  
the same thing.

I am so glad to hear that

place. I do hope that  
he will do well. I have  
no fears about his doing the  
work all right. If all the

succeed. Our sky seems to  
be brightening. The Arizona posi-  
tion would be a fine one for brother,

It is raining today, and mother  
is full again like starting  
home. I fear that sister will

to sit up too much. She cer-

I ought to be at home. It is
