MEMO TO MR. CARTER:

Here is a brief report on the Airport Advisory Committee Meeting in Miami which I attended representing you.

Charlie Horne was there only one day (Monday). He gave a report on what action had been taken by the C.A.A. on the recommendations given him at the last Committee meeting in Kansas City. The entire first day was taken up in the discussion of these recommendations, and a very heated discussion on the Doolittle report. Mr. Inwood of Kansas City objected very strenuously of the requirement in the Doolittle report that cities purchase the land for half a mile from the ends of each of the runways.

The second day was taken up in committee work and a report and discussion of the recommendations of the committees.


The third day was further discussions of these committees' reports and quite a lengthy discussion on runway markings. We are very interested, of course, in runway markings since our runways are new and will have to be marked prior to opening the Airport.

At the opening of the meeting I expressed your regrets at not being able to attend, and when I left I gave A. B. Curry and Phillips Moore your usual remembrance to them.

As you know, if this Committee is continued by the newly appointed administrator, the next meeting will be held in Fort Worth about the time we open the Airport.

For your confidential information, A. B. Curry plans to resign as Chairman of the Committee after the Fort Worth meeting. Personally, I feel that this will be a great loss to the Committee and I believe you feel the same way.

I know that you are very busy, but if you have the time one day next week, I would like for you to come out and I can show you around, for as you know, we have moved our office to the Airport.
