

At the meeting of the Cabinet Thursday the departments of English and Mathematics were given permission to organize classes in Freshman courses to meet five teams each week. These classes are, of course, for inferior students. The courses will carry the usual three hours credit.

The following calendar for the school year 1930-31 has been adopted:

Sept. 12-Friday-Beginning freshman organization.
Sept. 16-Tuesday-Freshman classes begin.
Sept. 18-Wednesday-All MWF classes meet.
Nov. 27-30, Inclusive-Thanksgiving holidays.
Dec. 20-Saturday-Dismiss for Christmas holidays.
Jan. 5-Monday-Resume class work.
Jan. 26-31, inclusive-Examinations, fall semester.
Feb. 2-Monday-Spring semester begins.
April 3-6, inclusive-Easter vacations.
May 30-June 5, inclusive,-Examinations, spring semester.

A major in physical education, leading to the degree of Bachelor of Education, will be offered by T. C. U., beginning next year. Full details of the new courses will be outlined in the forthcoming catalog. One of the chief adjustments provides that the courses in physical education, hitherto applied as elective hours toward any degree, will hereafter apply only on a Bachelor of Education degree with a major in physical education.

Mr. Tucker reports that the schedule for final examinations for the fall semester will be ready next week.

The catalog for the 1930 Summer Term is off the press. Copies may be obtained from Mr. Tucker's office.

The Faculty Bulletin was started as an experiment. So far, the experiment indicates that there is no need for a weekly bulletin. Until such need does develop, the Bulletin will be published semi-monthly, on the Friday following the regular Cabinet meetings, which are scheduled for the second and fourth Thursdays of each month.
