

In camp near Brownsville
June the 29th 1903

Dear Sister

As I have written
everything that would be of any interest
in father's letter my principle object in
writing to you is to send my love to a few special
friends for after writing father I
will have little else to write to you but I
cannot conveniently send a message of
love or respect in his letters to the girls

Give my love to Nannie Serena and
Mollie and tell Mollie and Serena that
I would have wrote to them if I had not
written several letters to them since receiving
theirs. In one of mine I proposed to write to
them as often as I had an opportunity of doing
so if they would do the same but I have not
received an answer and I don't know whether
they will do it or not but I can write to
you and Nannie for this is for her too
and you can tell S. & M. that I still
think of them. Tell Lou K that I would
like to hear of her Give her my love
kiss her and bot her on the cheek once for

me. See as I said I have nothing to write
So I will have to close soon.

Write often and write long letters
for I love to read long ones: if I donot
write long ones and tell all others to do the
same. I received the letter you sent by Capt.
Ross. I was glad to hear from Texas for I
considered the news cheering.

Tell Robert I am glad to hear of him giving so
much for hospital fund and also tell him
that he can do more that way than he could
in the army for he is too young to stand it.

Give my love to all and reserve to
yourself a large portion Love
